

Stephan Millet

Stephan Millet is an experienced K-12 classroom teacher of philosophy, who has been instrumental in the introduction of philosophy into Western Australian schools.

Stephan is a former newspaper editor and journalism academic, who spent seven years in school classrooms teaching philosophy. He holds a PhD in Philosophy from Murdoch University, for a dissertation on Aristotle's teleology and environmental ethics. He is a foundation Director of the Centre for Applied Ethics and Philosophy at Curtin University in Perth.

Dr Alan Tapper has taught philosophy at universities in Perth for 17 years. His main interest is in the 18th Century Enlightenment, and his PhD thesis was on the 18th Century chemist and polymath, Joseph Priestley. He also has an MA thesis on religious studies. His teaching career has been mainly in the areas of ethics, political philosophy and philosophy of religion.

Alan has also worked as a public policy researcher, both in the private sector and on government reports. He has written on Australian family issues, including a book, *The Family in the Welfare State* (1990).

Alan was chairperson of the Reference Group that wrote the new Philosophy and Ethics course of study.
